Tucked away in the folds of the beautiful **Hemel en Aarde Valley** near **Hermanus** in the Western Cape, lies a haven of tranquillity for children with intellectual and other disabilities. Established in 1952, as an independent, registered NPO 003-320 special needs school, Camphill has offered generations of children the opportunity for high quality education and care.



The brainchild of Hermanus resident, May Redman, in association with **Dr Karl König**, founder of the world-wide Camphill Movement, the School perpetuates his philosophy that all children, no matter what their disability, carry within them a divine spark of humanity, worthy of love, respect and nurturing. In this peaceful and caring environment, children are assisted to develop to their full, unique potential.



Our learners, aged between 7 and 18 years, many with multiple disabilities, receive high quality and individualised education in small classes, but they also have access to a wide range of therapies, from occupational and speech therapy, to eurythmy, music and art therapy. An educational psychologist is retained as a consultant.

With many of the learners requiring one-on-one attention, Camphill School is expensive to run. In fact, it costs the School roughly R6 000 a month to educate and care for a learner. More than 90% of the learners come from extremely disadvantaged communities, where the parents can afford little or nothing towards the already-low school fees, accounting for no more than 15% of the School's budget. The government subsidy covers only a further 23%, leaving it with a deficit of around 65% to source elsewhere.
